Southeast Asia is home to some of the world's best-known beach and island resorts; however, sewage and industrial effluents have degraded water quality throughout the region. As international tourists have become more aware of the

potential health risks, coastal water quality is emerging as an important determinant of the tourist industry's future growth there. An international workshop organized by IGCC, in partnership with the Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) and the World Bank, addressed the role public information programs can play in protecting human health and promoting more sustainable, more profitable recreation and tourism industries in Southeast Asia and around the world.
